VVA Meeting of 4/4/18

Call to order was made by President Mike Korger with the Pledge of Allegiance and Opening Prayer led by Sgt. at Arms Joe Graff. Welcome to our guest Steve Erickson, Jerry Bergstrom and new VVA member Jake (Sorry Jake, I didn't catch your last name and forgot to get it in time to print the newsletter.)

Secretary's Report: Motion made and seconded to accept the Secretary's Report as mailed and emailed was made and carried with a unanimous vote.

Treasurer's Report: Joe Heil gave the financial report, went over expenses paid, expected expenses, account balances and motion made to accept the Treasurer's Report was made by Larry Wrycza, seconded by Rory Schutte; motion carried.

President's Report: Mike Korger spoke of the American Legion 10th District Convention that he attended. He stated that Larry did not attend, but that Rory had. He also spoke of the Post 305 97th Anniversary Celebration coming up on May 11th and the Augusta American Legion Pancake Feed at the cabin starting at 7 a.m. until 1 p.m.

Ron Perry added that on May 12th in Ladysmith there will be a Ride for the Fallen starting with breakfast at 8 a.m. and then kickstands up at 11 a.m. There will be another event like this held later in September. Also, on Memorial Day there will be another Honor Ride at the Highground in Neillsville.

Dave Zein spoke of the week-long event being held around the area to celebrate Veterans and Home Front Heroes Appreciation Week. This event will begin on May 14th and go through May 19th. A second round of this event will be held from October 29th through November 3rd. There will be a special award for Home Front Hero going to our own AVVA member Sally Johnson.

Vice President's Report: Larry Wrycza spoke of VVA Chapter 351's Vietnam Memorabilia event held at CVTC on April 24th and spoke of an upcoming event to be held at UWEC.

AVVA Report: Julia McBee spoke of the upcoming VVA/AVVA Leadership Conference to be held in Palm Springs, CA later this July, and asked the VVA members for a matching \$75 contribution for the AVVA's Project Friendship to benefit LightHouse Social Service Centers that provide support services for veterans and families. Motion made by Joe Graff, seconded by Larry Wrycza; motion carried for a matching contribution of \$75 to be sent to Project Friendship. The AVVA's recent Pizza Ranch fundraiser was well attended and netted the AVVA members close to \$400. There will be another event on Wednesday, July 18th at Pizza Ranch so mark your calendars!

National VVA Convention: Next National Convention will be in Spokane, WA in 2019. Leadership Conference will be held in Palm Springs, CA this July from the 24th-28th.

State VVA Meeting: Next meeting will be held at Highground on June 16th. This will be an election meeting with a pot-luck picnic to follow. Those planning on attending should RSVP Mike Demske so he can have an accurate head count for the meat; State Council will be supplying the meat for grilling with attending members bringing a dish to share. Membership: 144- but new applications are being processed.

VA/Benefits: Pete Breed spoke on the Choice Act; it has been extended but not available to all veterans and may not all be free. The Choice Program is for those who have a wait of over 30 days for an appointment or live further than 40 miles from a VA medical center. However, in the example given regarding eye glasses, the only thing covered is the eye exam, NOT the eye glasses AND Choice picks out the provider and location to be seen at. Choice may still be going broke and the new name the VA is going to give the program will be Care. In the event you need emergency care, GO TO THE NEAREST MEDICAL FACILITY **NOT** the nearest VA medical facility; beware though, the VA can deny emergency care (just as other insurance can/will) if they deem that your claim is not truly an emergency.

Joe Heil informed everyone that the Eau Claire County DAV Van has now been approved to take veterans to the Tomah VA, but more drivers are needed before trips can start. Schedule is still for the van to make trips to Minneapolis on ODD days, Tomah will be on EVEN days.

Minority Report: Dave Zein spoke of the largest battle between Indian groups in Wisconsin, the Battle of 1861 and the 29 Resolutions. There will be a Ho Chunk National Memorial Day POW-WOW at the Andrew Blackhawk Memorial Pow-Wow Grounds in Black River Falls on May 26-28. There has been another sign approved between Mac Sear Cover and Dairy Queen on Menomonie Street honoring the Hmong of Vietnam on one side and Dennis Werlein and Resolution Number 28 on the other. More about this to come.

Women Veterans: Julia McBee requested a donation of \$100 for the upcoming WIDVA Women Veterans Retreat to be held on June 8th at Trinity Equestrian Center. Motion made by Joe Graff, seconded by Dick Quick for \$100 to Trinity for the Women Veterans Retreat; motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Veterans Home: Rory Schutte spoke of the May 20th baseball game between the Minnesota Twins and the Milwaukee Brewers, volunteers could be used to help with this event. The Recreation Committee has paid for this game and anyone willing to help can contact Katie at the Veterans Home. Joe Heil added information on the June 14th Golf Outing Event at Lake Hallie.

Highground: Joe Graff spoke of the Legacy Stone Laying on May 19th, Honor Ride/Memorial Day on May 28th, the Working Dog dedication on June 2nd, Volunteer appreciation luncheon and fireworks display on June 30th. There will be a stone laying for Dennis Werlein on September 15th, Chapter Color Guard is needed for this and we will have some sort of luncheon served afterwards. A warning for veterans

On Sunday, April 22, I had the privilege to attend the morning meeting of the American Legion 10th District Spring Conference at the Chippewa Falls American Legion post. I was in attendance as one of several Auxiliary members who continued with the second day of the conference.

Their guest speaker was Wisconsin State Commander Laurel Clewell. She spoke on several great issues to the Legionnaires. One that was brought up had to do with Vietnam veterans.

There is a parasite that attaches itself to the kidney and can cause death if untreated. You will not know you have this parasite until it is too late to treat. This parasite, often called "the fluke," came from the meats and fish that were available in Vietnam.

As a Vietnam veteran, you need to go to a VA Clinic and specifically request a blood test for the parasite. The clinic will not test for this unless you specifically request it. With the test, if you do have the parasite attached to your kidney, you can be treated more successfully.

If tested before symptoms appear you can be treated with medicine. If you begin to have symptons from this, treatment will be too late to be of any use.

This is something that needs to be brought to the attention of every Vietnam veteran out there. Please let other Vietnam veterans know.


