



CHAPTER MINUTES FROM 4/7/2021

Call to order by President Mike Korger, with the Pledge of Allegiance and Opening Prayer led by BOD Joe Graff; there were no guests or visitors present.

Secretary's Report: Motion made by Ralph Ottum, seconded by Rory Schutte, to accept last month's meeting minutes as mailed and emailed (it was noted the Treasurer's Report had been omitted) with further discussion; motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: All Chapter accounts balance with bank records; paid expenses, along with upcoming expenses reviewed and authorized, and Joe Heil was thanked for his report.

President's Report: Mike Korger welcomed everyone back to regular meetings again and shared that the Vietnam Veterans Day ceremony held on March 29th at VFW Post 305 had been a particularly good program, especially keynote speaker, John Schultz. The Fund-Raising Committee had met and decided to go ahead and hold a Raffle Ticket Fund Raiser and tickets are available for members to start selling. There was a virtual State Council meeting on March 15^{th,} and it was announced that the website, <u>www.vvawi.org</u>, had been hacked and that a new website is being created. There are tentative plans to hold the June meeting at Camp Victory in Willard on June 19th—this will be an election meeting, but it has not been decided if there will also be a potluck luncheon as in the past. *The Veteran* is now back in print format rather than just online. The Chippewa Valley Veterans Tribute Trail will have a dedication and Legacy Stone laying on May 31st after the Eau Claire Memorial Day parade, at Prairie Point Park in Altoona. Vice President's Report: Kenny Piel brought the handmade wooden United States flag that he is donating to the Chapter as a fund-raising prize.

AVVA: Rick Talford reports that AVVA National is still discussing its options for National Convention, whether it will be in person or online. Rick also presented a facemask that he received from VVA Board of Director at Large, Sandie Wilson, that benefits the children of Agent Orange program; efforts will be made to reach out to Sandie to find out more about the facemasks and how much of the cost benefits the program and will report back to membership next month.

State VVA Council: Upcoming meeting on June 19th at Camp Victory in Willard; a new State Council website is being created as the <u>www.vvawi.org</u> site has been hacked.

VVA Region 6: No regional meeting scheduled at this time.

VA/Benefits/Claims: No report, Dave Mayenchein absent.

Minority: Dave Zien recapped the Vietnam Veterans Day program held at VFW Post 305 on March 29th and thanked everyone who attended for their open-mindedness as there had not been any hassle pertaining to a trans-gender combat vet who was present that day. Also acknowledged was the upcoming Lao Hmong Veterans Day on May 14th and their contribution that enabled many US service members to make it home from Vietnam. Flyers were passed out for the upcoming May Armed Forces and Home Front Heroes Appreciation Week, May 10-15th.

Membership: VVA 123; AVVA 26

Veterans Home: Rory Schutte reports that the home is still closed to visitors. Pete Breed reminded everyone that if you are rated at 70% or more, there is no charge for your care at a veteran's home; additionally, the VA has now contracted with Dove Health Care in Rice Lake and Spooner for needed services.

Highground: Joe Graff reminded everyone that there will be a Work Week on May 12-15; the on-going POW-MIA & League of Wives Exhibit runs from April thru July; there will be a Legacy Stone laying on May 22; Honor

the Fallen Ride will be held Memorial Day, May 31st, to see all upcoming events, and/or volunteer opportunities (especially for Work Week), please visit their website, <u>www.thehighground.us</u> or call 715-743-4224 for more information.

Discussion then turned to various foundations that offer programs for aiding veterans. As was discussed last month about the Gary Sinise Foundation, 87.2% of donations goes directly to veterans; the Marine Corp. Fund gives 99% to veterans. As a group it was felt that any money the Chapter donates to veteran programs, we would like to keep it local, supporting veterans here in the Chippewa Valley area. Discussions to seek new programs or add to existing contributions will be ongoing and no final decisions were made tonight.

Chapter 5 will be participating in the Eau Claire Memorial Day parade, members are needed to march, walk alongside and greet veterans in the crowd. Joe Heil asked what members thought of having banners that could drape over the sides of his truck highlighting our raffle fund-raiser, Joe Graff volunteered to get banners made promoting our fund-raiser that could be used during the parade and at various county fair events. Motion made by Mac McBee, seconded by Rory Schutte, to allow Joe Graff to have two 3'x5' banners made up for the 2021 fund-raiser; motion carried.

May 31st will be a busy day with the Chapter marching in the Eau Claire parade, which should be concluded by 11:30 a.m., and then reassembling at the Veterans Tribute Trail at Prairie Point Park in Altoona for the dedication of the Tribute Trail and the laying of Legacy Stones, both individual and the Chapter's stone; discussion turned to the wording of the plaque on the Chapter's bench that will be next to the Vietnam Veterans of America podium. At this time, it is unclear if the bench will be ready for the dedication in May, but it is planned for.

Join Sheriff Mack, Constitutional Sheriffs & Peace Officers Association President, on April 10th at Lilydale Dance Hall & Event Venue in Chippewa Falls for the 4th Annual Wisconsin Regional Patriot Meeting from 1:00-4:00 p.m. for a presentation followed with Q&A with Sheriff Mack. Legislation was recently introduced in LRB 2788 to make Wisconsin a 2nd Amendment Sanctuary State.

\$20 Attendance Drawing was won by Richard Meier, not present, so next month's drawing will be for \$30. The 50/50 Drawing was won by Rory Schutte. There were 19 members present at tonight's meeting. Joe Graff gave the closing prayer, and the meeting was adjourned.
