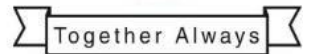

VVA Meeting of 10/4/2017

- NOTE: Board of Directors meeting not held at 6 p.m. due to insufficient member presence. Board of Directors meeting rescheduled for October 17th, at 1 p.m. in Osseo.

Meeting was called to order by President Mike Korger at 7 pm. Pledge of Allegiance was led by Sergeant at Arms, Joe Graff as was the Opening Prayer and Moment of Silence for those fallen and missing. Additional prayers were asked for all those members who are dealing with illness. Welcome new members and guests by Joe Heil who mentioned the Hero Hunt in Willard, WI on various dates. For more information, please contact Joe Heil.

Secretary's Report: Motion made by Larry Wrycza to accept the Secretary's Report for the minutes of last month's meeting as mailed, seconded by Joe Graff and motion carried. NOTE: Joe Heil emailed the report to those who receive email copies—they weren't received and he will resend them, anyone not receiving an emailed version, please contact Joe to be sure he has your correct email address.

Treasurer's Report: Joe Heil spoke of the Chapter's finances and preliminary fundraiser numbers. For the Pizza Ranch event, the chapter received \$189 as our portion of the restaurants income, \$236 in tips (Thank You members for your excellent service!) and we were able to sell an additional \$245 in raffle tickets. As for our October 1st Chicken Feed, while the final totals aren't available, it looks like we did very, very well—comparable to last year's joint event with the VFW. Motion to accept the Treasurer's Report made by Ralph Ottum, seconded by Tom Neunefeldt and motion carried.

President's Report: Mike Korger thanked everyone for their hard work for the Pizza Ranch and October Chicken Feed Fundraiser events. He then reminded everyone of some upcoming events at the Veterans Home in Chippewa Falls; Veterans Ball on November 4th, Blood Drive on November 11th, VFW Christmas Party on December 1st, and our own VVA/DAV Christmas Party on December 8th. Mike then spoke of the funeral service that was held for member Dennis Schramm and the memorial service that was held this afternoon at the Highground.

Vice President's Report: Larry Wrycza recognized Ralph Ottum for selling the most raffle tickets for this year's fundraiser and offered his apologies for not being around as he has been busy and has had truck issues.

AVVA Report: Julie read Sharon Hobbs Thank You note to the Chapter and thanked everyone for their help in the fundraising activities this year.

National VVA Convention: Next National Convention will be in Spokane, WA in 2019.

State VVA Meeting: Veteran Suicide Prevention Program was held on Friday, September 22nd and Joe Graff gave a summary of the day's events; the first half was on PTSD and the second

half of the day was by Dr.'s Berger and Hall on suicide prevention. One Marine who was present stood up and told the group, "If you don't know what you're doing, don't! Call the Police or Sheriff to have the situation dealt with and DON'T say, 'I know' Be patient with the individual but get help." State Council meeting summary was provided by Mac and Julie McBee; the Car Show at the Dells wasn't quite the success hoped for, but plans are starting now for a better show next year. The big topic of discussion was the Household Goods account that nobody seems to have a good understanding of; there is money in an account and it needs to be used so it was the suggestion, and carried by vote, that the State Council will ask all Chapters to endorse to the State their portion of the Household Goods account and the State will utilize the proceeds for education and veteran's programs in the State. Letters explaining all this will be sent to the Chapters and should be received by our November meeting. The next scheduled State Council meeting is in December with a Christmas Dinner on Friday night, 12/1 and State Council meeting on Saturday, 12/2. Joe Heil will be attending, if anyone is interested please contact him. With our Chaplain, Dennis Werlein, currently in the hospital I thought that perhaps it would be a good time, and in keeping with the month of November and Thanksgiving, to remember how the national day of observance began, and how we too have much to be thankful for, even in times of strife. What follows is taken from "Abraham Lincoln Online."

""Proclamation of Thanksgiving

This is the proclamation which set the precedent for America's national day of Thanksgiving. During his administration, President Lincoln issued many orders similar to this. For example, on November 28, 1861, he ordered government departments closed for a local day of thanksgiving.

Sarah Josepha Hale, a 74-year-old magazine editor, wrote a letter to Lincoln on September 28, 1863, urging him to have the "day of our annual Thanksgiving made a National and fixed Union Festival." She explained, "you may have observed that, for some years past, there has been an increasing interest felt in our land to have the Thanksgiving held on the same day, in all the States; it now needs National recognition and authoritative fixation, only to become permanently, an American custom and institution."

Prior to this, each state scheduled its own Thanksgiving holiday at different times, mainly in New England and other Northern states. President Lincoln responded to Mrs. Hale's request immediately, unlike several of his predecessors, who ignored her petitions altogether. In her

letter to Lincoln she mentioned that she had been advocating a national thanksgiving date for 15 years as the editor of Godey's *Lady's Book*. George Washington was the first president to proclaim a day of thanksgiving, issuing his request on October 3, 1789, exactly 4 years before Lincoln's.

The document below sets apart the last Thursday of November "as a day of Thanksgiving and Praise." According to an April 1, 1854 letter from John Nicolay, one of President Lincoln's secretaries, this document was written by Secretary of State William Seward, and the original was in his handwriting. On October 3, 1863, fellow Cabinet member Gideon Welles recorded in his diary how he complimented Seward on his work. A year later the manuscript was sold to benefit Union troops.

**Washington, D.C.
October 3, 1863**

**By the President of the United States of America.
A Proclamation.**

The year that is drawing towards its close, has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies. To these bounties, which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the source from which they come, others have been added, which are of so extraordinary a nature, that they cannot fail to penetrate and soften even the heart which is habitually insensible to the ever watchful providence of Almighty God. In the midst of a civil war of unequalled magnitude and severity, which has sometimes seemed to foreign States to invite and to provoke their aggression, peace has been preserved with all nations, order has been maintained, the laws have been respected and obeyed, and harmony has prevailed everywhere except in the theatre of military conflict; while that theatre has been greatly contracted by the advancing armies and navies of the Union. Needful diversions of wealth and of strength from the fields of peaceful industry to the national defence, have not arrested the plough, the shuttle or the ship; the axe has enlarged the borders of our settlements, and the mines, as well of iron and coal as of the precious metals, have yielded even more abundantly than heretofore. Population has steadily increased, notwithstanding the waste that has been made in the camp, the siege and the battle-field; and the country, rejoicing in the consciousness of augmented strength and vigor, is permitted to expect continuance of years with large increase of freedom. No human counsel hath devised nor hath any mortal hand worked out these great things. They are the gracious gifts of the Most High God, who, while dealing with us in anger for our sins, hath nevertheless remembered mercy. It has seemed to me fit and proper that they should be solemnly, reverently and gratefully acknowledged as with one heart and one voice by the whole American People. I do therefore invite my fellow citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November next, as a day of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the Heavens. And I recommend to them that while offering up the ascriptions justly due Him for such singular deliverances and blessings, they do also with humble penitence for our national perverseness and

disobedience, commend to His tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife in which we are unavoidably engaged, and fervently implore the interposition of the Almighty Hand to heal the wounds of the nation and to restore it as soon as may be consistent with the Divine purposes to the full enjoyment of peace, harmony, tranquility and Union.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the United States to be affixed.

Done at the City of Washington, this Third day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and of the Independence of the United States the Eighty-eighth.


